

Dato' Varghese A/L George Varughese
Retired Court of Appeal Judge

Dato' Varghese A/L George Varughese graduated with a LLB degree from the University of Singapore in 1974. He was in private legal practice for 35 years with the firm of Messrs Zain & Co, Kuala Lumpur, involved principally in civil litigation work specialising in commercial, land related, administrative and construction law disputes. He was the Senior Partner of the firm when in 2009 he was appointed a Judicial Commissioner. He was elevated as a Judge of the High Court, Malaya in August 2011 and thereafter as a Judge of the Court of Appeal, Malaysia in October 2013. He retired from the Judiciary at the end of January 2017. He is a Fellow of both the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators (FCIArb) and the Malaysian Institute of Arbitrators (FMArbs). He is an accredited Mediator, Adjudicator and Arbitrator with the AIAC (formerly KLRC) and currently sits as Adjudicator and as Arbitrator in various Ad Hoc and Institutional arbitration cases. He has also given talks on Advocacy in courts, Court Room Ethics and Etiquette and have chaired and participated in seminars as speaker/debater on Arbitration related issues and developments both locally and internationally.

Ravi Nekoo was admitted as an Advocate and Solicitor of the High Court of Malaya in 1995. He obtained his Bachelor of Laws degree from the University of London (External) in 1992 and completed his Certificate of Legal Practice examination in 1994. Then, he went on to do his Masters in Law degree at the University of Malaya in 2001 and completed his Masters in Criminal Justice degree at the same university in 2003.

He has been in practice for 23 years, has been a litigator throughout his practice and has appeared at all levels of the court in Malaysia. He is the author of *Malaysian Civil Procedure And Practice (The Malaysian Current Law Journal)*.
